Advent Wreath:

Each week during Advent we lit a candle on the wreath. Every time we lit a candle, we remembered an aspirational attitude that helped us prepare for the coming of the Lord.

The four candles represent: hope, peace, joy and love.

Today, all over the world, the birth of Jesus is celebrated in many different ways, some of them strange to us, but all having one purpose ... to express our joy about Jesus' coming.

We remember Jesus not only as a tiny baby, but also as a grown man. We recall how He loved people, how He helped them, how He taught them, and how He changed their lives. Let us also remember that we too, can learn how to live by following the way He lived.

A fifth candle in the centre of the others, represents Jesus the Light of the world. He came to show us how to live. Let us celebrate His birthday by trying to live as He did.

We light this candle as a sign that Jesus has come.

<u>Sermon</u>

The Nicene Creed:

Drink this, all of you. This is My blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember Me.

Glory to You Lord Christ. Your death we show forth; Your resurrection we proclaim; Your coming we await. Amen! Come Lord Jesus.

Therefore, loving God, recalling Your great goodness to us in Christ, His suffering and death; His resurrection and ascension; and looking for His coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation. Accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving which we offer through Christ our great high priest.

Send Your Holy Spirit, that these gifts of bread and wine which we receive, may be to us the body and blood of Christ, and that we, filled with the Spirit's grace and power, may be renewed for the service of Your kingdom.

United in Christ with all who stand before You in earth and heaven, we worship You, O God in songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing, honour and glory be Yours, here and everywhere, now and forever. Amen.
