Greetings:

It's good to be back. We had a lovely time and got everything done that we needed to ... just not in the manner we planned (weather). Thank you, it was a good break.

This morning, we welcome our Archdeacon Rev Peter Bargh. I will leave Peter to introduce himself, but it's good to have him come and see what's going on here. It's always helpful to have a review from time to time and share ideas about what might be possible in our context. Peter, you are welcome here anytime ... as you are able.

The gospel today blends two things; one technical, the other very simple, albeit demanding. *Glorification* can be a difficult thing to get your head around, but if you think of it as giving God the best you can and then making sure He is recognised/given credit for what He has enabled you to achieve ... you're getting close.

The second is 'the New Commandment' ... that we love one another as we have been loved. This requires that we have some appreciation of how much we're loved by the One Who created us and gave His life for us ... very simple in theory ... but anybody can love the lovable. Jesus calls us to a higher task ... to love the others on His behalf. To do this, we must first love ourselves enough, and have confidence in Him to let Him lift us up and sustain us in the moments we dread ... to *truly love* those that we find it difficult to identify with/ understand/ be in the presence of ... *to the extent that we've been loved*. Big ask ... but no bigger than the effort it took to love us in the first place!
