# <u>Greetings:</u>

On Thursday of this week, we celebrated the **Conversion of St Paul**. We took a break from our journey through Genesis for a moment, to read about Ezekiel's isolation and silencing which, in some ways resembles the experience of Saul on the road to Damascus when he became Paul. But I recall the image of what happens in Acts 7, when Stephen is being stoned at the Jewish Council's behest, with Saul's approval. Cloaks are piled up at Saul's feet and he sees Stephen being "filled with the Holy Spirit." He is present at the revelation to Stephen of "the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God." Whether or not he experienced those things for himself, when you are in the presence of the holy, you cannot fail to be affected yourself. I wonder what part that experience played in his own conversion of the road to Damascus.

This week Vestry started thinking about the **AGM** and **Vestry 2024**. We will be seeking a new People's Warden this time and there are always spaces on Vestry for those who feel a call in this direction. If everybody shares a little of the load from time to time, then nobody suffers unduly from carrying a larger part of the burden for a while. In addition, I believe that men and women share equal responsibilities in the eyes of the Lord, so our Vestry should reflect approximately equal numbers of men and women (it's pretty close at the moment).
