# Greetings:

For those of you who were not at the AGM last week we have a new Vicar's Warden (Roger Clark) a new People's Warden (Angela Stensness) and a revised Vestry (Bill Aldridge, Tim Cross, Sue Reed, Liz Skivington) with Tim also continuing as our Lay Synod's rep. We expressed our grateful thanks for the services of Betty Owen and Bill Aldridge who have both given hours of service over many years and who have both decided to take a rest from their previous high level of commitment in their respective ways. Vestry has moved to the third Tuesday night of each month to accommodate our Study Group schedule.

While we have again delivered a sound financial report in 2023 (ahead of budget) it was noted that our 2024 budget is once again, forecasting a deficit (we may spend more than we anticipate bringing in) with insurance costs now being nearly 300% of the price we have paid before. Lynda and I continue to take a conservative approach to our discretionary spending and are confident that by being prudent we will do what we can to "finish in the black."

Our gospel this week is John 12: 20-33. This text follows on from the Pharisees planning to kill Lazarus (whom Jesus raised from the dead) recognising that they have lost the battle to control Jesus' effectiveness.

It's clear to us now, that this kind of thinking completely upends what God was trying to achieve at the beginning of Creation. Jesus came among us to make the Good News of the Kingdom available to everybody, in every nation, in every age ... if we will only agree to accept His gift freely offered.
