# Greetings:

In our liturgical calendar this week we have commemorated three extraordinary individuals each worth appreciating as heroes of the faith, even if they leave us feeling a little tired when we consider what they achieved. They are each well worth a Google search.

Albert Schweitzer (1875-1965) was one of those truly gifted Christians who set aside a life of potential fame and fortune to be an academic in history and natural science, a doctor of medicine, a missionary in French Equatorial Africa, a theologian, a musician of note and an author. He used his extensive talent to raise funds and build a 350 bed general hospital, as well as a leprosy hospital for 200 patients by holding organ recitals throughout Europe.

Mother Teresa (1910-1997) is well known for her work and life among the poorest of the poor in India, but she ignored the criticisms of those who said that she did nothing to alleviate the causes of that poverty, or address the social injustices that accompanied it. Instead she focussed her energy and talent on those suffering its consequences; she was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1979.

A little closer to home was **Charles Fox** (1878-1977). A missionary, historian and anthropologist, he served the Anglican Church in Melanesia for over 70 years. He came to NZ as a 6 year old when his father was appointed the Vicar of Gisborne. He first went to the Solomon Islands in 1903 and set up a school for boys on San Cristobal, but also worked for 11 years, as the only European member of the Melanesian Brotherhood. During the Second World War he was a coast-watcher and successfully evaded capture by the Japanese with the help of the Melanesian people. He was an expert in the local language and published several books about the people. He also translated the *Bible* and the *Book of Common Prayer* for local use.
