# Greetings:

If we didn't have a special guest preacher this morning, we would be looking at the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin. While the *lost coin* story is in a different category for me, it does incorporate women into the narrative in a way that many among Jesus' audience could relate to, but the *lost sheep* is an interesting one ... how many of you would really leave the ninety-nine and go in search of the one? Real world economics and a standard risk assessment approach might encourage us instead, to consider the value of the many, and the possibility of losing more if we aren't there to watch the remainder. But that's not what Jesus is talking about.

Jesus says that the ninety-nine aren't lost and therefore don't need His help, and that He will pursue that one who is lost to recover them to the fold, irrespective of whatever else is going on. I don't know about you, but I find that comforting. Whenever we are lost, dislocated, anxious, afraid, confused, or somehow otherwise out of sorts we become especially important to Him and He will seek us out and bring us home. Thanks be to God!
