<u>Greetings:</u>

This week I attended a one-day seminar at Holy Trinity where the speaker was Matua Matt Hakiaha. He's a truly gifted communicator able to listen and speak to both sides of our cultural divide. His topic was *Te Ao Māori and Christian Ministry in the 21st Century*. Among other things, he highlighted that as Christians we need to make space for God *and* for each other ... and to listen with grace and with peace. Another speaker identified that we are coming from two completely different understandings of the spiritual world, not in a bad way, but in a way which shapes our whole understanding of everything.

The thing that struck me the most was the shared recognition that God is bigger than any other idea or worldly reality ... if it's OK with God our Father, our Saviour and the Holy Spirit it's OK with us. There are many things we can share and come to grips with, if we let ourselves sit and listen with grace ... let's focus on those ... in the love of Jesus Christ.
