Liturgy: p.456 OT 7 Psalm 37: 1-11, 39-40

Greetings:

Today's gospel is one that is particularly difficult to put into effect ... but it's perhaps the most important; "forgive others, as you would like to be forgiven." If you've ever endured the pain and indignity of crime or violence inflicted on you or someone you love, you will know the feeling of powerlessness and injustice that comes with it. It's very difficult early on to contemplate letting go of that hurt and turning it into love for an offender. In some ways we want our hurt to continue so that we can feel justified in sustaining our anger and pain.

But think for a moment ... that's precisely how we make our loving Lord and Father feel when we sin. Every sin we commit is only ever against Him. He made us to love Him and love each other, in a way that leaves us free to live our lives to the very best extent possible ... way more joyfully and completely than we can imagine.

Forgiveness is not forgetting. Forgiveness is not excusing or condoning. Forgiveness is letting go the hurt and injustice we feel, so that our loving of others can begin again and our relationship with the Father can be restored. It also allows the offender to lay down the shame that prevents them from starting again ... to love others the way they are loved.
