

Greetings:

Palm Sunday ... where does that idea come from? Mark says "Many people spread their *cloaks* on the road" and adds that "some spread *leafy branches* that they had cut in the field." Matthew and Luke don't mention branches or leaves of any sort. Only John's gospel contains the detail we bring to mind this day. Whether it was actually just cloaks or some sort of leafy branches/palms as well ... none of us here today miss the imperative.

This was the culmination of Jesus' ministry among us; recognition of His Divine calling. In less than a week He will be dead to the only *life* His disciples have ever known as a consequence of the lies and betrayal of those He came to save BUT *waiting* for His eternal curtaincall ... and, as a consequence of that call, *we are saved* ... for everything to which we are called, forever!

This season reminds me that we are not saved *per se* ... we are saved *for something*. *What that is* remains elusive ... but there is nothing more certain ... we are each called ... it's what we do *next* that matters.

Over the next few days, we have several opportunities to remember our first encounter ... what was it that first drew us into Him ... and why did we respond the way we did? We also have several opportunities to refresh our commitment to that call.

Let me assure you, the task has not gone away; not everyone has been saved yet, and Creation is still in a mess ... so there's still plenty to do. What's next on our list? We don't have to do it all at once ... but the longer we wait, the further we still have to go.
